The children really enjoyed taking full ownership of the craft with little help or input from staff.

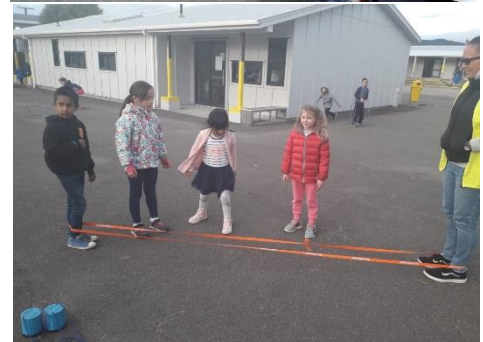
